The Stories We All Share

You think "up to you" actually means it's your decision.

You proudly use your new Thai vocabulary only to discover you've said something completely different.

You discover there really is a 7-Eleven on every corner.

You spend twenty minutes looking for your flip-flops while you're wearing them.

You pack four suitcases of clothes...

...and end up wearing the same three T-shirts every week because it's thirty-five degrees outside.

If you've lived here long enough, you've probably smiled because one of those happened to you too.

It helps us admit mistakes.

It reminds us not to take ourselves too seriously.

The expats who seem happiest in Thailand usually have one thing in common.

They've learned to smile when things don't go according to plan.

Eventually, almost everything becomes a story.

The Lessons Hidden Inside the Laughter

Every Two Beer Bob story ends with something more than a punchline.

There's usually a practical lesson hiding underneath.

Maybe it's:

Ask questions.

Don't assume.

Be patient.
